Master in Pastoral Ministry

Master's Degree - Professional Track based on CMO 15 s.2019 Art 3 Section 7 II-B

The Master in Pastoral Ministry (MPM) is a professional degree program recognized by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), designed to produce pastors having personal maturity and professional ministry competence. It is aimed to equip students for effective service in the varied areas of ministry which include, but are not limited to, preaching, teaching, church planting, personal counseling, chaplaincy, and evangelism.

MPM seeks to help students to develop the ability to understand and interpret the Christian faith in the light of its biblical, theological, and historical contexts and to utilize insights gained from these disciplines for the effective practice of ministry in the church, the community, and the world.

This degree program is aimed as a two-year full-time residential study, with a Capstone Ministry Project in the student's final year.

The Master in Pastoral Ministry is for individuals who sense a calling towards pastoral leadership in a variety of contexts, particularly the local church.

- Demonstrate expertise in comprehensive theoretical knowledge in pastoral ministry as a whole;
- Apply specialized theoretical knowledge to understand and solve various problems related to pastoral ministry in a holistic manner;
- Plan and implement advanced independent and collaborative efforts in conducting various ministries and services within the church, its surrounding community, and the world; and
- Exemplify appreciation and life-long commitment to theological education, research, and ministry in service to the church and society.
